- Mercury-containing products (fluorescent light bulbs, thermostats, etc.)

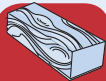


Tires

- Additional fees for tractor & heavy equipment tires, accepted at Central Disposal Site only.
- 9 tires maximum per load

Fee:
\$5/passenger tire (16" wheel size or less)
\$10/truck tire (17"-24" wheel size)

Wood & pallets

- Lumber, unpainted
- Pallets
- Plywood
- Wood siding & chips
- OSB (oriented strand board)

Fee:
\$27.60/ton at Central Disposal Site
\$29.70/ton at transfer stations

Yard debris

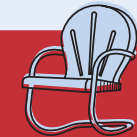
- Tree trunks (less than 30 inches in diameter), leaves, grass & prunings. No stumps.
- Fruit & vegetables
- Bread, rice & pasta
- Eggshells
- Manure
- Coffee filters

Fee:
\$34.10/ton at Central Disposal Site
\$36.20/ton at transfer stations

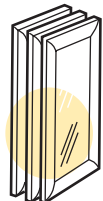

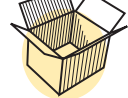

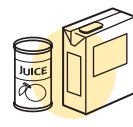
