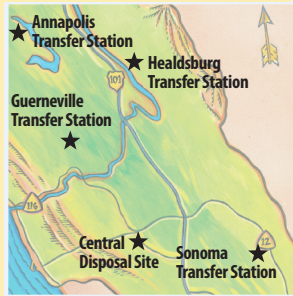


VISITING DISPOSAL SITES

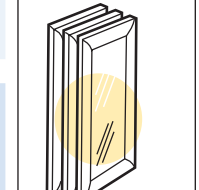
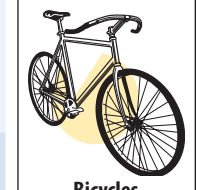
Disposal & recycling M-Sa 7-5, Su 8-5 586-6666/585-8246 Directions: Santa Rosa Ave, south of Todd Rd.

The following items must be separated from garbage, as they require special handling or can be recycled:

- Appliances, Cardboard, Tires, Scrap metal, Electronic devices, Yard debris & recyclable wood including treated wood, Hazardous waste (mercury-containing products, fluorescent light bulbs, thermostats, paint, sharps, etc.)

REUSE Free drop-off



Some restrictions may apply; check with on-site attendant.

RECYCLING Free drop-off of recyclables at ALL County Refuse Disposal Sites

Remember, different materials go into different bins. Some restrictions may apply; check with on-site attendant.

Recycling categories: Newspaper & inserts, Magazines & junk mail, Office paper, Telephone, paperback books & catalogs, Cardboard (flattened), cereal & shoe boxes, Paper bags & egg cartons, Wrapping paper & tissue (nonmetallic only).

Not accepted: Paper used for personal hygiene • Food-contaminated paper • Shredded paper • Photos • Blueprints • Waxed cardboard or paper • Coffee cups and plastic lids

Cans, glass & cartons; Plastic containers & rigid plastics. Includes icons of cans, bottles, and plastic containers.

Cans (all kinds), bottles & jars & aerosol cans (empty & without pressure) & milk, broth, soy/rice milk & juice boxes. Empty plastic containers & rigid plastic items 5-gallon buckets • Laundry baskets • Plastic lids larger than 4 inches in diameter • Plastic toys • Play equipment • Lawn furniture • Infant car seats (fabric covers removed) • Nursery pots & plant 6-packs • CD jewel cases, provided the front paper covers are removed • Quart-sized motor oil containers (drain for 48 hours) • Clamshells

Not accepted: Dishes • Mirrors • Light bulbs. Not accepted*: Plastic bags • Photos • Hoses • HDPE & PVC pipe • Styrofoam, such as takeout food containers or meat trays • Terra-cotta nursery pots • Vinyl siding • Plexiglass • Straws • Plastic utensils, chip or candy wrappers (Mylar material)

NOTE: No plastic bags or shredded paper. Metal, scrap. Ferrous & nonferrous metals smaller than 4 foot by 8 foot.
