

# Get rid of toxic materials before disaster strikes - and help keep our waterways clean Here's how:

The Floods and North Bay Fires of 2017 have made us all more aware of the hazardous materials in our homes. Before the rains, rid your home of toxics and other hazards at this **FREE Flood Awareness Community Toxics Collection**. The Sonoma County Waste Management Agency has added this collection event to assist Sonoma County residents in clearing out their homes and garages of unwanted household hazardous waste.

**Guerneville Road Yard: December 2, 8:30am - 3:30pm**

14900 Armstrong Woods Road, Guerneville

This event is for **RESIDENTS ONLY**, no businesses.  
Community Toxics Collections are  
**NOT** for burned properties and will **NOT** accept burned material.

*All homes damaged by fires are to be serviced through official debris cleanups. Information can be found at [sonomacountyrecovers.org](http://sonomacountyrecovers.org)*

**LIMIT: A maximum of 15 gallons of liquid (with a maximum of 5 gallons per container) or 125 pounds of solid material allowed per vehicle.**

**NOTE: Packing and Transportation of Hazards:** Never mix chemicals • Place in sealed containers in the trunk, packed to prevent spills • Syringes/needles must be in a sealed and labeled approved container.

*Examples of Household Hazardous Waste: paint, batteries, fluorescent lamps, cleaners, solvents, pool chemicals, poisons.*

**Not Accepted:** Electronics • Explosives or ammunition • Radioactive materials • Biological wastes (except syringes) • Controlled substances • Fire damaged material or ashes.
